Additional Learning Needs 2021-2022

Mrs Helen Ansell is responsible for Additional Learning Needs provision at school which involves regular discussions with teachers, support staff and parents. Specific tasks and Individual Development Plans (IDP) are given to children with Additional Learning Needs (ALN) who have been identified as needing Additional Learning Provision (ALP), with the other children on universal or targeted interventions. Teachers and support staff work hard to implement these plans as the children strive to succeed with their targets.

We work with relevant outside agencies to ensure appropriate support and some pupils have benefited from one-to-one support. We fully comply with the Additional Learning Needs and Education Tribunal (Wales) Act which has been in effect for Nursery and years 1, 3 & 5 since January 2022, with the Special Educational Needs Code being phased out for the other year groups.
